Guerrilla Recording - John Stoecker

An artist to artist/writer to writer workshop that is an introduction to recording with portable recorders. Using a handy recorder with or without a Mac or PC laptop may be a useful solution If you want to record live shows, demos, work tapes, and capture ideas quickly and efficiently (and inexpensively). The seminar covers specific (low cost) hardware and programs while trying to avoid jargon, and covers the basics of getting immediate results. This isn't about "home recording" (equipping your own studio at home), although as is the case with any recording situation, there are basic aspects that are in common, and this could be a starting place if you are non-technical or have never had your own setup. A detailed handout will be distributed to attendees.

Road-Dog Survival Tips: A Non-Music-Industry Approach to Managing Your Own Folk Music Performance Career - Jack Williams, Kelly Mulhollan, Donna Stjerna- (Still on the Hill), Kari Estrin A panel-Q&A discussion of the methods and the ups and downs of doing it all yourself: booking, publicity, promotion/marketing, career-planning, radio-play, logistics of touring, driving and crying while writing or practicing. This discussion is for performing artists who - like the panelists - do most or all of the work themselves and who prefer to go it alone and who are beholden to no one but themselves and their audiences. We'll discuss helpful information for those artists who've been at it for a long time and for those who are new to touring in

the folk community. This is for artists who - like the panelists - have chosen to not operate their careers according to systems established by the commercial music industry, and not according to aspirations of commercial success beyond the folk realm.
